

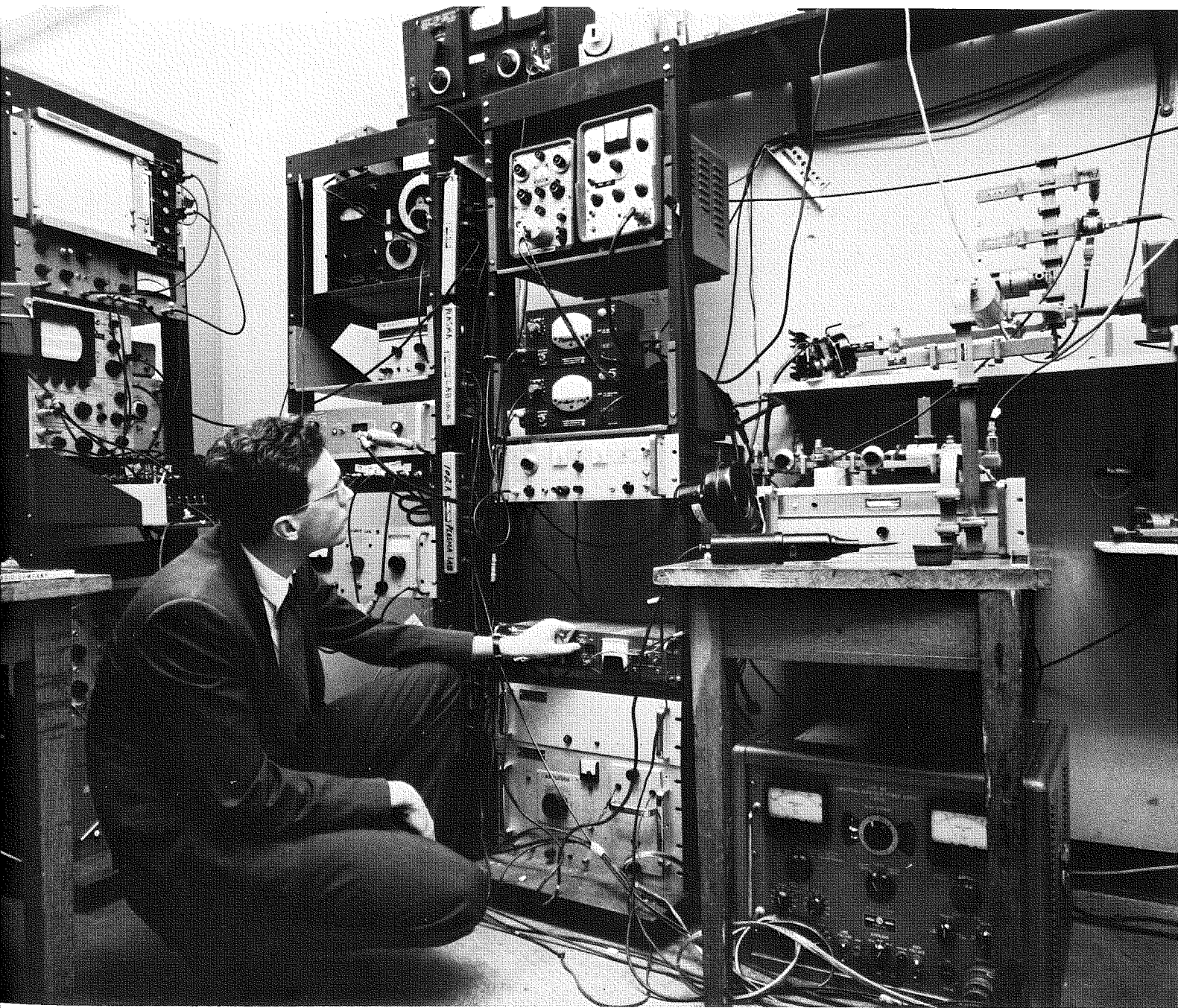


Columbia Engineer 1971
